There is also the option to explore a shortened version of this course.

Navigation is relatively easy.

There are slopes, small crags and undergrowth along the way. Courses avoid the main car parking areas but please take extra care if the overflow parking area is in use.

### WHERE IS THE START?



The start is located on the lakeshore, just south of the cafe area and jetties



### COURSES AVAILABLE

There are three line courses of varied length and difficulty with checkpoints hidden across the park. The orange course extends to the meadow area.

15 controls Yellow 1.3 km (medium and easy)

16 controls Orange 2.5 km (longer and medium difficulty)

# Grasmere Village Trail



### AREA

Postcode: LA22 9SL Grid Ref: NY339072

What 3 Words: districts.dean.quieter Parking: Stock Lane Car Park (Pay and Display) or nearby A591 layby (free)

Public transport: Bus stop at Grasmere School

Toilets: Public toilets in car park

Pram/Wheelchair friendly? Yes, apart from a short section in the woods which can be bypassed.

Well behaved dogs? Yes (on a lead)

### SAFETY NOTES

You take part in this activity at your own risk and children must be supervised by a responsible adult.

This can be a busy village - please take care to avoid collision. Please be aware that there are short roadside sections and road crossings so please look out for traffic. There are slopes, small crags and undergrowth along the way. The trail also follows the open riverside path for a short time.

### WHERE IS THE START?



The start is located on a bridge on the footpath behind Grasmere School



### COURSES AVAILABLE

The line course/trail takes you through the pretty village of Grasmere and it's outskirts with some lovely views of the fells along the way. It also visits a woodland and the playground. This course uses a Street Map rather than a standard orienteering map.

Approx 2km 21 controls

## Orrest Head, Windermere



### AREA

Postcode: LA23 1AQ Grid Ref: SD4129878

What 3 Words: paddlers.wound.scoping Parking: A591 laybys or Windermere Centre Public Transport: very close to Windermere Train station which is also the nearest bus stop.

Toilets: available in Booths.

Pram/Wheelchair friendly? The first half of the course up to the summit is accessible. Well behaved dogs? Yes

#### SAFETY NOTES

You take part in this activity at your own risk and children must be supervised by a responsible adult.

Please be aware that some sections of the paths, including the area around the summit and particularly the section beyond the summit, are steep and sometimes slippery. There are slopes, small crags and undergrowth along the way. This is a popular route - please take care to avoid collision with other users including dogs. Ticks may be present - please check.

### WHERE IS THE START?



The start is located just off the A591 signposted to Orrest Head.



### **COURSES AVAILABLE**

The line course/trail takes you on footpaths to the summit of Orrest Head for amazing views across Windermere to the surrounding fells.

Watch out for the Gruffalo in the woods! Navigation is relatively easy.

Toilets: Public toilets in the park

Pram/Wheelchair friendly? Yes (apart from two controls in the woodland section to the North)

Well-behaved dogs? Yes (except in the playground)

#### SAFETY NOTES

You take part in this activity at your own risk and children must be supervised by a responsible adult.

This can be a busy park. Please take care to avoid collision with other park users. Please be aware that a section of the park is open to the river and there are numerous crags. There are some nettles and brambles to avoid in the woodland section. There is a possibility of moving cars near the finish.

### WHERE IS THE START?



The start is located in the centre of Rothay Park. The finish is next to Ambleside Primary School.



### COURSES AVAILABLE

This is a score course.

The aim is to visit as many controls as you can in 45 minutes. Each control is worth 10 points, but don't be late to the finish!

The course is suitable for all abilities as you plan your own route and visit the controls that you feel confident that you can find.

Please be aware that the course starts with a steep climb and paths can sometimes be slippery. There are slopes, small crags and undergrowth along the way. This is a popular route - please take care to avoid collision with other users including sheep. Ticks may be present - please check.

### WHERE IS THE START?



The start is located just beyond the North end of Ford Park.



### COURSES AVAILABLE

This line course/trail follows the footpaths on the open fell up to the monument and back through Ford Park.

Navigation is relatively easy and the course visits lots of different features along the way.
