

Lakeland Orienteering Club Filming & Photography Policy

Lakeland Orienteering Club are well aware of the wide range of devices including mobile telephones which have photographic and filming capabilities. This enables the capture of both static and moving images. It should be acknowledged that the majority of images taken within a Lakeland Orienteering Club environment are appropriate and taken in good faith. However, images of children and adults can be misused, and sharing images widely without consent may betray a confidence or identify of a child or adult, which could present a risk of harm to that individual if common sense procedures are not followed. Also, it must be recognised that photos now fall within the legislation of UK GDPR.

Parent/Carers of participants under the age of 18 and adults at risk, who wish to take images are requested to focus on their children as much as reasonably possible and to avoid including other children in images, particularly if those images are being shared with family and friends or through social media platforms. Whilst it is acknowledged that parents/Carers wish to celebrate the achievements of their children when taking part in orienteering events, it should be recognised and respected that other parents/carers may not wish for their child's image to be taken and shared in this way.

Lakeland Orienteering Club encourages all spectators and participants at Lakeland Orienteering Club events to make themselves familiar with the photography and filming arrangements for the event and be vigilant during that event.

Lakeland Orienteering Club is committed to ensuring that all children and adults at risk who participate in Lakeland Orienteering Club activities can take part in an enjoyable, safe environment and be safeguarded from harm. Event Photography and Filming

All Lakeland Orienteering Clubs events will be photographed and potentially video recorded. Static images may be displayed on the Lakeland Orienteering Club website <https://www.lakeland-orienteering.org.uk>. They may be used to promote the sport at this event and events in the future. Both static and moving images may also be displayed on the Lakeland Orienteering Clubs social media platforms. Also, Lakeland Orienteering Club may use these recordings and images for education and training, promotion, and development purposes.

In such instances where the event is being videoed, it will not be possible to provide the option to refuse consent to filming and if there are any concerns, please speak to the Event Organiser present. However, if individuals wish to refuse consent to static photography, please complete the Photography Refusal of Consent Form below and return to the organiser.
